



## City of Powell Police Department *Police Officer*

Salary Range: \$55,570.51 - \$80,337

The City of Powell, Ohio has one (1) vacancy for the full-time position of Police Officer. The Powell Police Department utilizes the National Testing Network to develop an eligibility list. Interested persons should submit a formal application through the National Testing Network using the following website: <https://nationaltestingnetwork.com>.

Applicants should select Powell Police as an agency of interest and follow the instructions on how to apply. Applicants will then be able to select a testing location and date from the website. Military, college degree or current Ohio Peace Officer Training Certificate credits are available for those who qualify, and such credit will be added to the candidate's written score. Applicants will be notified of all elements of the selection process, the expected duration of the selection process and the agency's policy on reapplication.

Candidates must score an eighty (80) percent on the video portion on the written test to advance in the selection process. The top twenty (20) candidates based on the video score component of the written test (and any earned military, educational or current peace officer credits) will then compose the eligibility list that the Powell Police Department will utilize moving forward in the selection process. Those potential credits will only be applied to those applicants who scored an eighty (80) percent or higher on the video portion of the written test.

In order to have your written test score be considered for this vacancy, you must have taken the written examination with the National Testing Network by **March 3, 2017**. Applicants must also submit their DD214s, Ohio Peace Officer Certificates or any diplomas to the Powell Police Department by 5:00 PM EST on March 3, 2017 in order to have any earned credits applied to their overall score. ### Requirements at the time of appointment:

- United States citizen, or possess a valid permanent resident card;
- Fluently read and speak English;
- Successful completion of a State Certified Peace Officer basic training program (not required prior to appointment but must be able to attend and successfully complete a State certified Peace Officer basic training program at the time of appointment);
- Must be 21 or older at the time of appointment;
- Valid Ohio driver's license;
- High school diploma or equivalent certificate, with a preference for a degree from an accredited institution of higher learning;
- No felony convictions;
- Must be able to successfully complete all stages of the selection process to include application phase, oral interviews, background investigation, truth verification examination, medical examination and psychological examination.

Lateral Hires: Applicants who are currently certified Peace Officers and have prior full-time law enforcement experience are eligible to start at a higher wage step at the discretion of the Chief of Police.
