Petition to the City of Powell

Currently, there are 3 proposals that are being contemplated for approval by city government that will add 135 apartments and/or condominiums within a quarter-mile of the Olentangy/Powell and Liberty Rd intersection (four corners) in downtown Powell. In addition, there is another conceptual proposal to add an additional 165+ apartments, plus retail in the same area. *Currently, City Council is considering for approval, **Powell Crossing**, which will add 64 apartments with rents as low as \$700 per month. Unit density will be 7.7 units per acre. Additionally, the development will include 14,000 sq. ft. of retail.*

Besides the low rent noted above, these developments will, among other things:

- add more cars to the already heavily congested downtown Powell traffic;
- put additional strain on the school system (building capacities/redistricting);
- increase the burden on current city resources endangering public safety and property.
- threaten the charm and small town appeal of the city;

WE, the Concerned Homeowners of Powell support development, but only development that maintains Powell's small town, family friendly, upscale appeal.

Therefore, by this petition, WE are asking Powell's city leaders to delay these projects, while it works with its constituents to re-address the future of Powell's downtown and address the above issues. Further, we are asking for a NO vote on the Powell Crossing development as presented.
