5/6/2016 ACDA | Injuries | Unit 1 failed to mainta in an assured clear distance a head and asa result, struck unit 2 from behind. At the time of the collision both vehic les were heading eastbound on SR 750 in Liberty Twp.

5/7/2016 ACDA | Unit 1 failed to mainta in an assured clear distance ahead and as a result, struck unit 2 from behind. At the time of the collision both vehicles were heading westbound on SR 750 . Unit 1 wascited.

5/9/2016 Deer| Unit 1 was tra veling south on Sa wmill Parkway when a deer ran out in front of her. Unit 1 struck the deer.

5/10/2016 Failure to Control| Unit 2 was parked in the area of 30 W . Olentangy St. Unit 1 was westbound on W. Olentangy St.

Unit 1's passenger side mirror struck unit 2's driver's side mirror.

5/12/2016 ACDA | Unit 1 failed to mainta in an assured clear distance ahead and as a result, struck unit 2 from behind. At the time of the collision both vehic les were heading north on Sa wmill Pkwy. Unit 1 wascited.

5/13/2016 ACDA | Unit 2 wasstopping/slowing in traffic when Unit 1 stuck Unit 2 in the rearcenter. Unit 1 wascited.

5/18/2016 Stop Sign | Unit 1 was westbound on Presidential Parkway at the intersection of Sawmill Road. The driver of unit 1 did not see unit 2 that was northbound on Sa wmill Road. Unit 2 struck Unit 1. Unit 1 was cited.

5/25/2016 ACDA | Injuries | Units 1 and 2 were eastbound on SR750 just east of the railroad tracks. Unit 2 stopped for traffic and Unit 1 failed to stop and struck the rear of Unit 2. The driver of Unit 1 stated her foot slipped off the brake. Unit 1 was cited.

5/27/2016 Fying Object| Unit 1 was westbound on SR750 at Thombury Lane. The unit wasstruck by a piece of metal which shattered the driver's side second window and traveled through the passenger compartment. The driver of the vehicle found the piece of metal in the rear of the vehicle asit struck and broke the plastic molding on the passengerside. The driver reports that there were landscapers working in the area. It a ppears likely that metal was thrown from a mower.

5/28/2016 ACDA | Unit 2 was stopped in traffic and was struck from behind by unit 1 who failed to mainta in an assured clear distance ahead. At the time of the collision, both units were westbound on SR 750 .Unit 1 was cited.

5/31/2016 ACDA | Unit 2 was slowing in traffic, eastbound on SR 750 at Thombury Ln . Unit 1 was also eastbound on SR 750, behind Unit 2. Unit 1 failed to use assured clear distance ahead and struck Unit 2. Unit 1 wascited.

## STEALTH STAT

The Stealth Stat was deployed in May on Scioto Street, Grandshire Drive, and Winter Hill Place.

On Scioto Street, there were 18 vehic les per hour. The posted speed limit is 10 miles per hour. The average speed was 15 miles per hour. The maximum speed was 46 miles perhour.
