#### **NOTABLE CASES**







# **13-MONTH PATTERN OF CRASHES**



#### **TRAFFIC CRASHES – PUBLIC PROPERTY**

- 9/2/2016 **Backing** | Unit one improperly backed and as a result, struck unit two which was legally parked on the roadway. At the time of the collision, both units were in front of 443 Zion Drive.
- 9/7/2016 Hit Skip | The mailbox at 319 Elmendorf was struck by an unknown vehicle or machine. Possibly caused by construction equipment in the area. Crash was not taken as official hit skip as it was unlikely known that damage was caused.
- 9/12/16 **Failure to Control** | Unit 2 was parked on Aspenknoll Dr. Unit 1 was westbound on Aspenknoll Dr. Unit 1's driver fell asleep and Unit 1 struck Unit 2. Unit 1 was cited.
- 9/18/2016 Failure to Control | A vehicle was broken down on S.R. 750 near Liberty St. Unit 1 was attempting to pass while the driver was outside of the vehicle and struck her. Unit 1 was cited.
- 9/24/2016 **OVI** | Unit 1 was eastbound on S. R. 750 at Valley Run Dr. Unit 1 drove off the right side of the roadway, struck a curb and a stop sign. Unit 1 continued southeast striking a sign, a rock flowerbed border, several bushes and a fence. The driver was arrested for OVI, reckless operation, and failure to control.
- 9/30/2016 **Hit-Skip** | Unit 1 struck a mailbox on W. Olentangy St. at Hall St. and left the scene without reporting the crash.
- 9/30/2016 **Stop Sign** | Unit 1 failed to stop at a sign and as a result struck Unit 2. At the time of the collision Unit 2 was heading southbound on Sawmill Road while Unit 1 was heading westbound on Grey Oaks Drive approaching/entering Sawmill Road. Unit 1 was cited.


