MEETING MINUTES

Oct. 18, 2016 | 6:30 p.m.

I. BODY CAMERA PRESENTATION

Police Chief Gary Vest presented information regarding the squad/body cameras as well as the server upgrade. The committee that worked on researching body cameras for the Police Department selected the WatchGuard body cameras. The pros of WatchGuard include: activates with in-car cameras, replaces current body mic, adjustable lens turret, operated well in testing, best video and panorama, covert mode (daylight vs. nighttime), and files body and in-car video together. There was only one con: bulky design, but wouldn't be a problem on a duty belt.

Chief Vest also presented photos of the City's current server system and addressed questions. Finance Director Debra Miller and GIS/Planner Rocky Kambo answered questions related to the potential phone system upgrade.

The committee decided to move forward with the police squad car and body cameras as well as the new phone system and server upgrade.

II. KEEP POWELL MOVING UPDATE

Communications Director Megan Canavan provided a brief update regarding the Keep Powell Moving Initiative. The Planning & Zoning Commission will review the proposed plan during their next meeting on Oct. 26<sup>th</sup> and then City Council will review the plan during their Nov. 1<sup>st</sup> meeting. The City is also working with MurphyEpson to finalize the FAQs.

The Committee decided to not proceed with the Jade Track proposal at this time.
