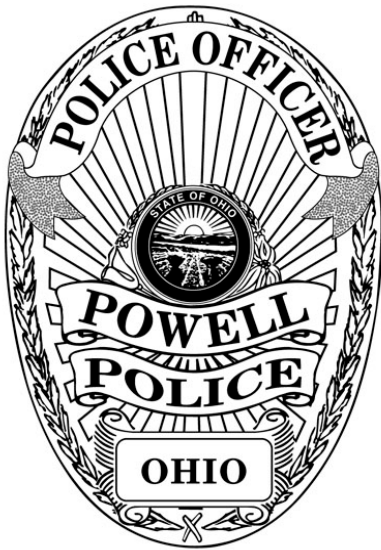

NOTABLE CASES

Grandparent Scam | A resident received a call from a female claiming to be his granddaughter. She said she was in jail and needed \$3,000. The victim bought Amazon.com gift cards and read the numbers to a man posing as a public defender. That man demanded another \$4,500, but the victim contacted his granddaughter and realized it was a scam.

Identity Theft | A resident reported that unknown suspect(s) took over his retirement account and transferred \$62,000 out of it. The case is under investigation.

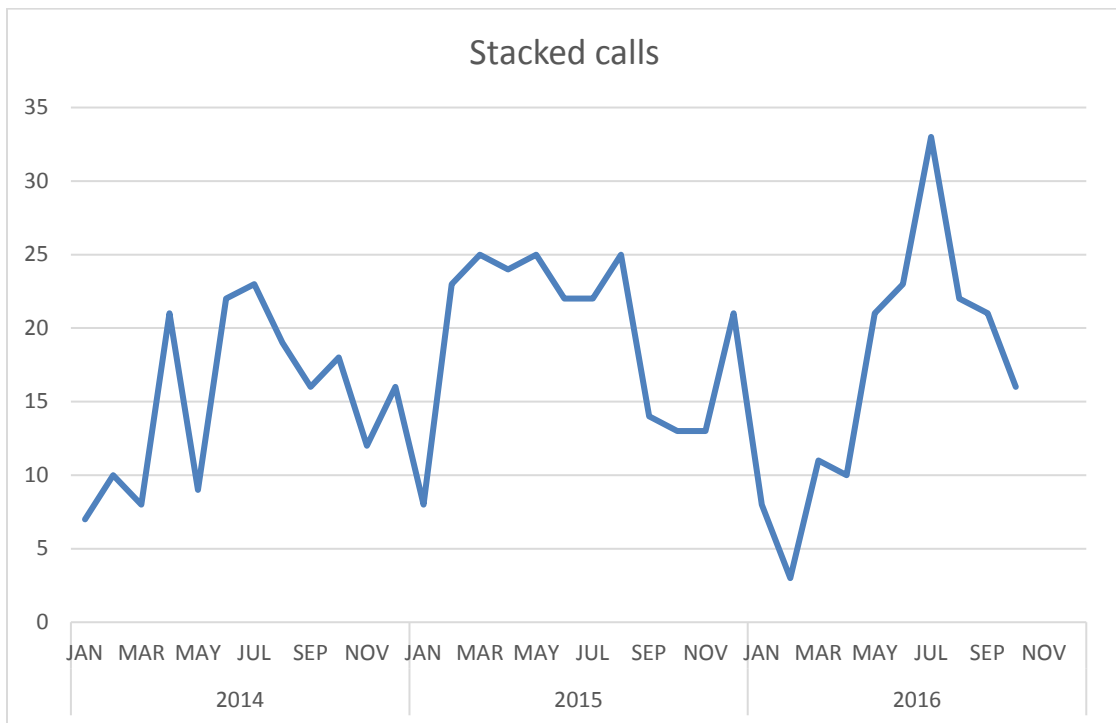
Prescription Fraud | A business on Sawmill Parkway reported that two suspects brought in fraudulent prescriptions. The case is under investigation.

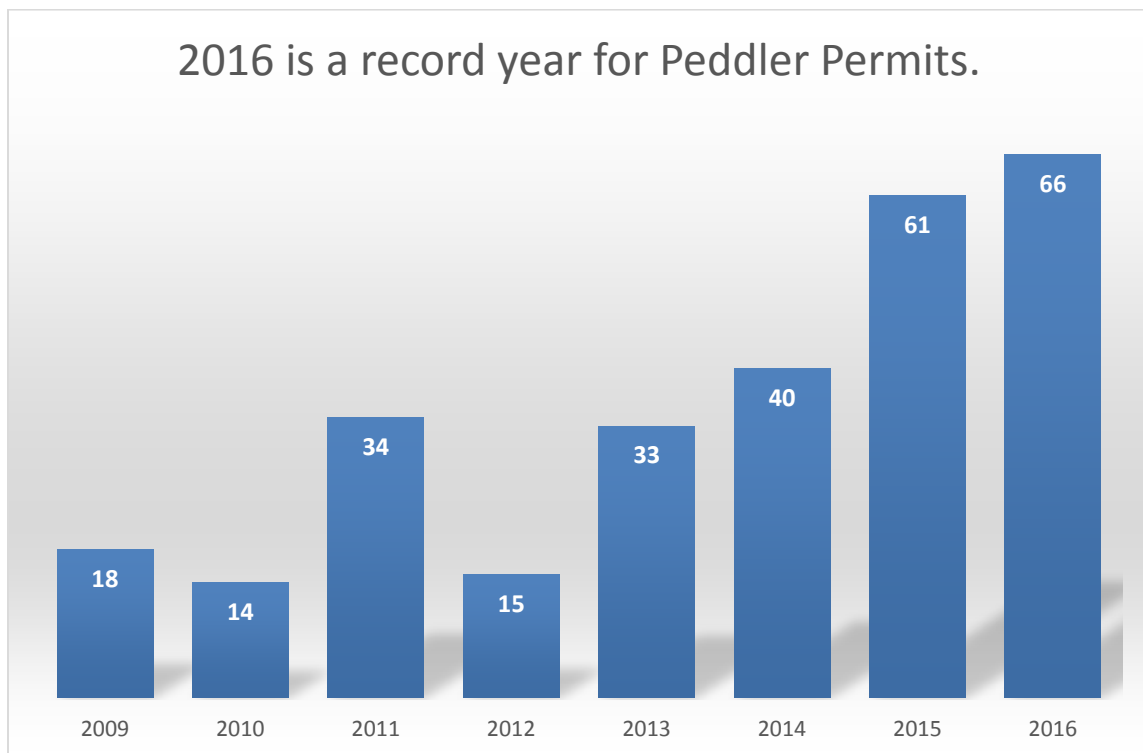

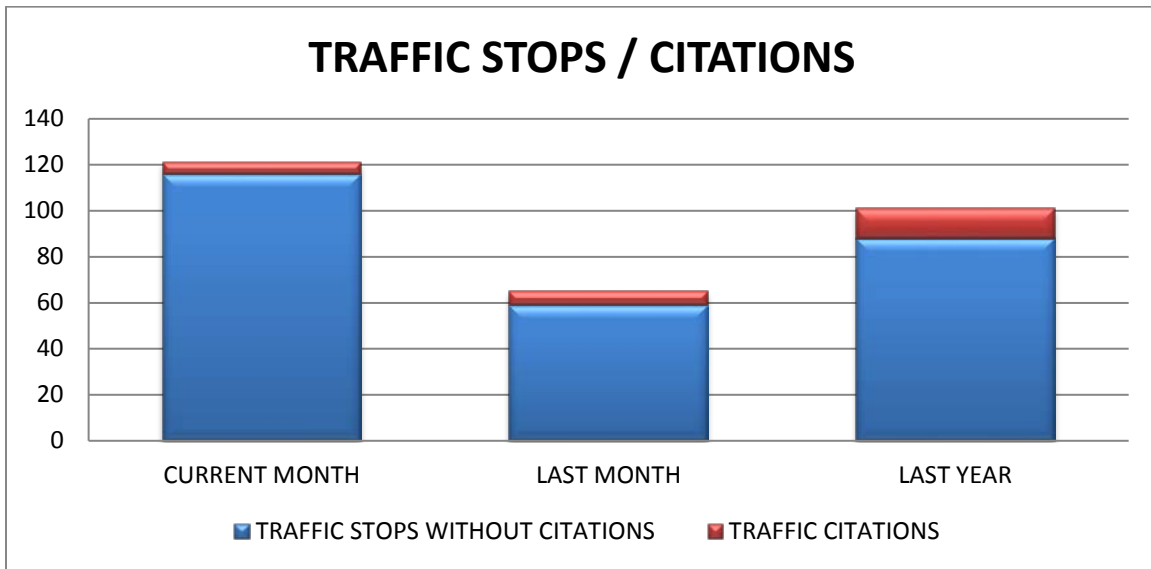
STACKED CALLS



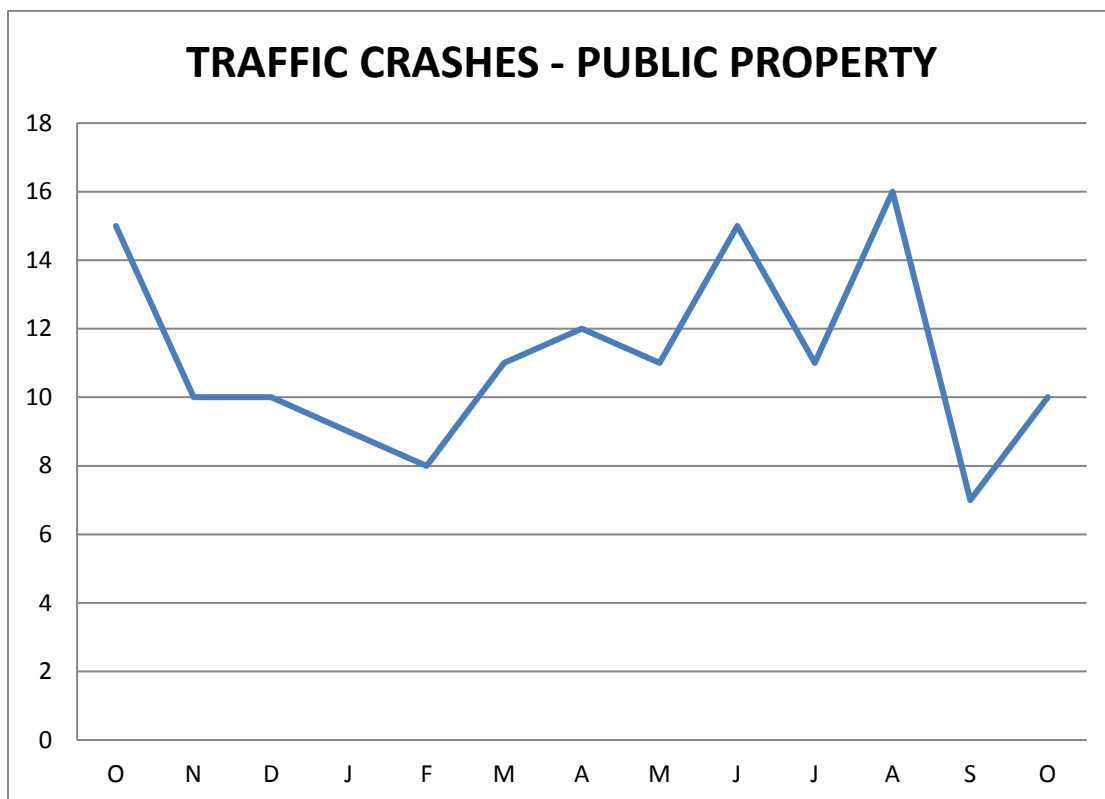
PEDDLER PERMITS

13-MONTH PATTERN OF CRASHES



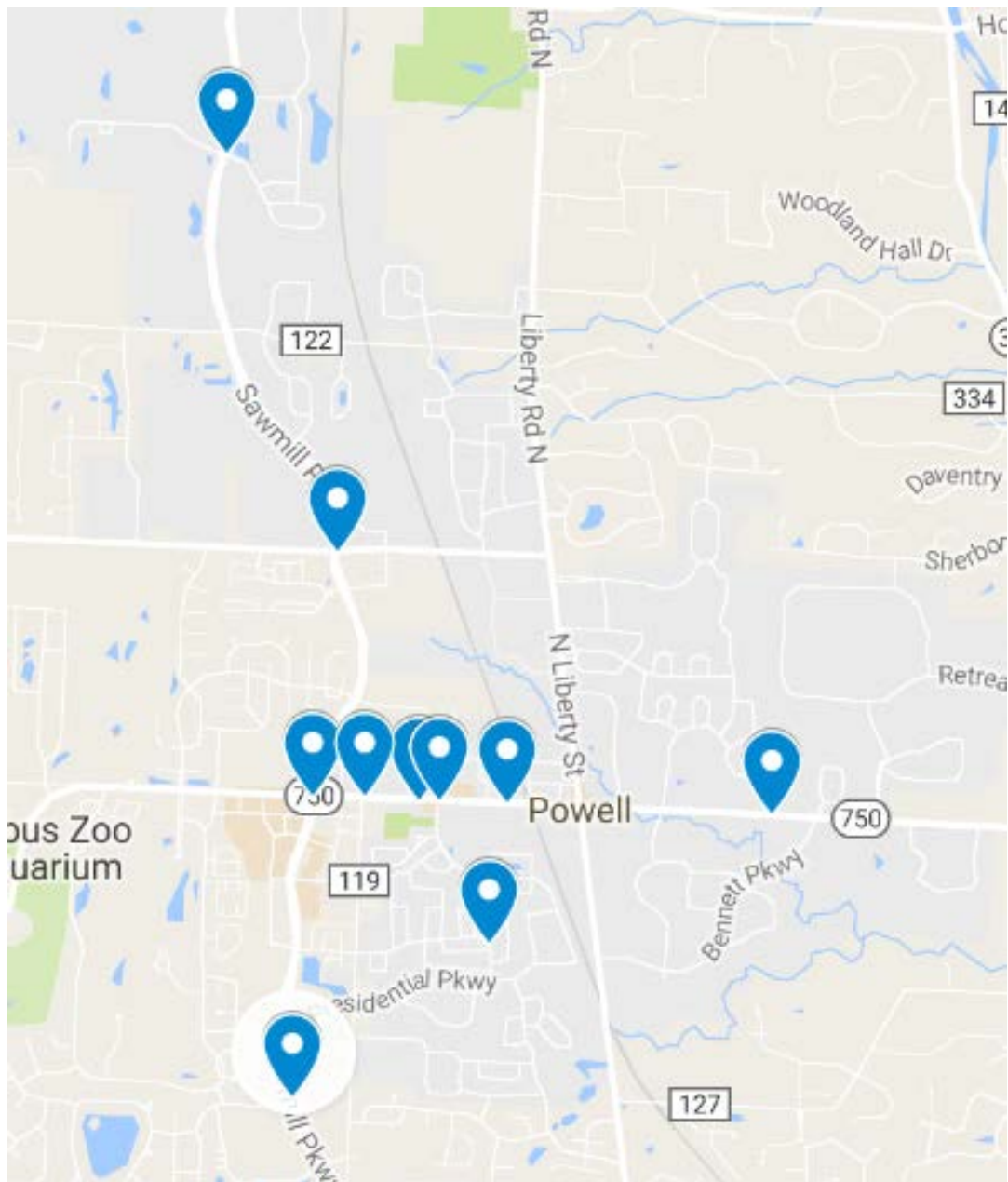
TRAFFIC CRASHES – PUBLIC PROPERTY

- 10/2/2016 **Failure to Control** | Unit 1 was northbound on Grandshire Drive near Bethany Avenue. Unit 1 drove over the curb and struck several trees.
- 10/6/2016 **Stop Light** | *Injuries* | Unit 1 was at the intersection of Seldom Seen and Sawmill Parkway westbound on Seldom Seen. The traffic signal for east and westbound bound traffic (Seldom Seen traffic) turned green, and Unit 1 started to enter the intersection. Unit 2 was northbound on Sawmill Parkway, and entered the intersection on a red light. Unit 1 struck Unit 2, forcing Unit 2 into the southbound lanes of Sawmill Parkway.
- 10/12/2016 **Marked Lanes** | Unit 1 swerved to avoid construction workers on the shoulder and struck Unit 2 in the side forcing her into the median.
- 10/12/2016 **ACDA** | Unit 2 was stopped in traffic eastbound on SR 750. Unit 1 failed to have assured clear distance ahead and rear ended Unit 2.
- 10/15/2016 **ACDA** | Unit 1 and Unit 2 were westbound on SR 750 just east of Village Pointe Drive. Unit 2 stopped for traffic and Unit 1, unable to stop, struck the rear of Unit 2.
- 10/17/2016 **Failure to Yield** | Unit 2 was traveling south on Sawmill Parkway as he neared the intersection of Village Club Drive. Unit 1 was turning right off of Village Club Drive onto Sawmill Parkway. It was established a crash occurred, however, due to conflicting statements and no witnesses it is unclear which party is at fault.
- 10/17/2016 **Failure to Yield** | *Injuries* | Unit 1 was making a left turn off SR 750 turning onto Sawmill Road. Unit 2 was cycling past the intersection of Sawmill Road and SR. Unit 1 turned left and struck Unit 2. Unit 2 driver was injured.
- 10/21/2016 **Hit-Skip** | Unit 2 was headed eastbound on SR 750 as Unit 1 was approaching Unit 2 westbound on SR 750. A garage door came out of the bed of Unit 1 and struck the passenger side of the windshield on Unit 2. Unit 1 did not stop.

10/25/2016 **Failure to Yield** | Unit 2 was westbound on SR 750. Unit 1 was southbound on Olentangy Ridge Place. Unit 1 tried to turn left onto SR 750 and struck the side of Unit 2.

10/27/2016 **Deer** | Unit 1 was traveling south on Sawmill Parkway when a deer ran across the road. Unit 1 was not able to stop in time and struck the deer.
