Summary of Notable Revenue and Expenditure Items As of May 31, 2017

Revenue

- Municipal Income Tax: We have collected \$2,585,822.83 or 44.51% (through RITA) of our 2017 budget of \$5,809,472.00.
- Municipal Income Tax: Comparing 2017 municipal income tax collection to 2016 (year-to-date period) we are up 6.81%.
- Real Estate Taxes: We usually collect in two installments (March and August). We collected \$293,550.82 or 51.66%. Our 2017 budget was \$568,290.20.
- Development Fees: We have collected \$376,622.95 or 57.19% of our 2017 budget of \$658,584.00.
- Local Government Fund: We have collected \$66,315.56 or 37.42% of our 2017 budget of \$177,230.22.
- All Other General Fund Revenues: We have collected \$449,978.28 or 62.97% of our 2017 budget of \$714,634.12.
- Other Fund Revenues:
 - Parks & Recreation Programs Fund: We have collected \$143,178.50 or 86.77% of our 2017 budget of \$165,000.00 for Recreation; and we collected \$84,960.00 or 65.35% of our 2017 budget of \$130,000 for Powell Festival.
 - Debt Service Funds: We have collected \$3,949,926.60 or 54.17% of our 2017 budget of \$7,291,751.41.
 - Downtown TIF: We collect in two installments (March and August). We collected \$147,159.79 or 49.43% of our 2017 budget of \$297,700.00.
 - Sawmill Corridor TIF: We collect in two installments (March and August). We collected \$154,961.04 or 66.65% of our 2017 budget of \$232,500.00.
 - Seldom Seen TIF: No collections have begun. However, we are collecting interest off the 1-year note of \$1,645.07.

Expenditures

Anticipated percentage range of expenditures is usually 39.0 to 48.0% for May.

- Administration – expenditures were \$112,588.60, which is 37.43% of their budget.
- Building – expenditures were \$247,830.61, which is 37.62% of their budget.
- Communications – expenditures were \$58,832.15, which is 31.64% of their budget.
- Council/Clerk – expenditures were \$100,102.22, which is 42.10% of their budget.
- Development – expenditures were \$113,629.12, which is 38.73% of their budget.
- Engineering – expenditures were \$141,167.10, which is 35.93% of their budget.
- Finance – expenditures were \$280,002.30, which is 38.48% of their budget.
- Information Technology – expenditures were \$155,932.56, which is 68.36% of their budget. The annual cost of I.T. assistance consultant is paid for the entire year in January.
- Lands & Buildings – expenditures were \$69,247.65, which is 28.77% of their budget.

- Other Charges – expenditures were \$163,679.86, which is 45.56% of their budget.
- Park Maintenance – expenditures were \$186,035.38, which is 29.73% of their budget.
- Police – expenditures were \$1,128,142.04, which is 32.35% of their budget.
- Public Service – expenditures were \$250,204.57 which is 26.02% of their budget.
- Contingencies – as of May, we utilized \$0.00 -----leaving a balance of \$75,000.00.
- Other Funds:
 - Parks & Recreation Program Fund – expenditures are \$51,741.98 for recreation, which is 28.90% budget. The biggest sessions are the spring and summer. Expenditures are \$12,148.60 for Powell Festival, which is 10.90% of their budget.
 - Debt Service Funds – expenditures are \$3,526,674.42, which is 45.99% of their budget. Expenditures are usually seen in May (for June 1 due date) and November (for December 1 due date). However, the refinancing of the 1-year note to a bank loan was done in February.

Other Items of Interest:

- ▶ The “Development” fees are what we look at to see if approximately 50% of the costs for the Building, Development and Engineering Departments are covered by the fees generated. It is estimated that approximately half of their work is related to city services and those services should be covered by resident taxes.

Development Fees and Expenditures through May are \$376,622.95 and \$502,626.83, respectively. Development Fees paid 74.93% of the costs.

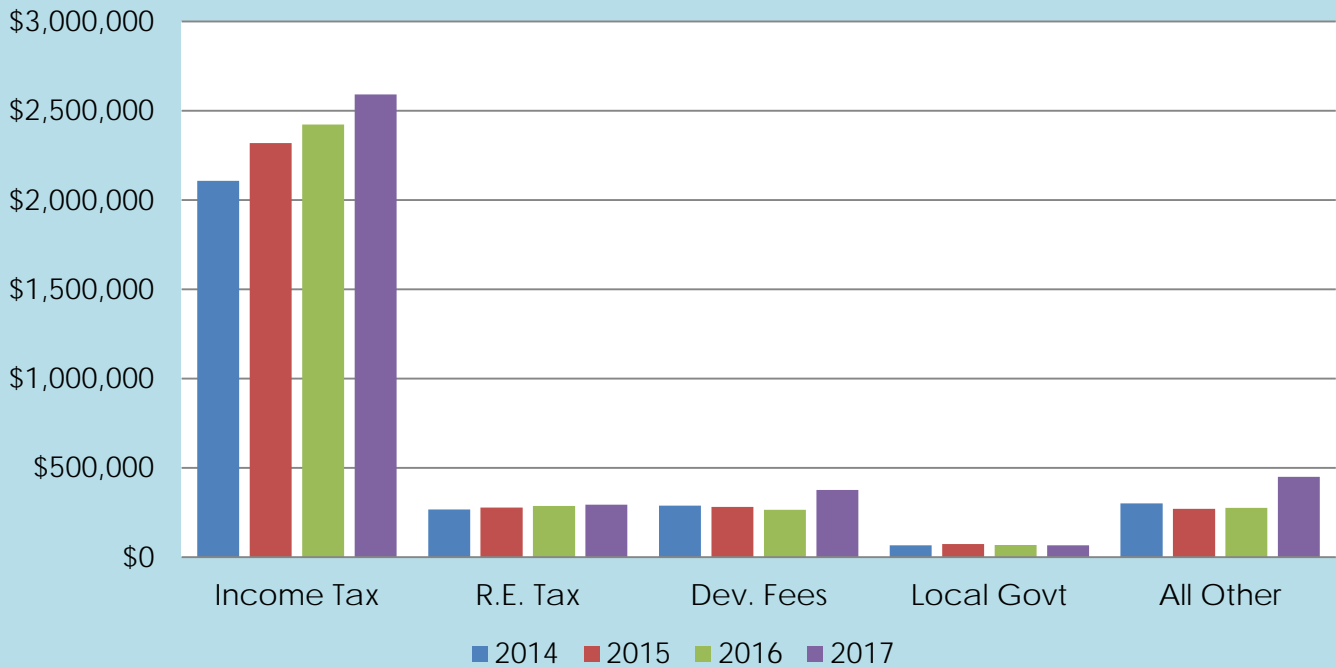
- ▶ The “Programming” revenues are what we look at to see if the Parks Programming is self-sufficient or close to being self-sufficient are direct costs.

Recreation Fees and Expenditures through May are \$143,178.50 and \$51,741.98, respectively. Recreation Fees paid 276.72% of the costs.
