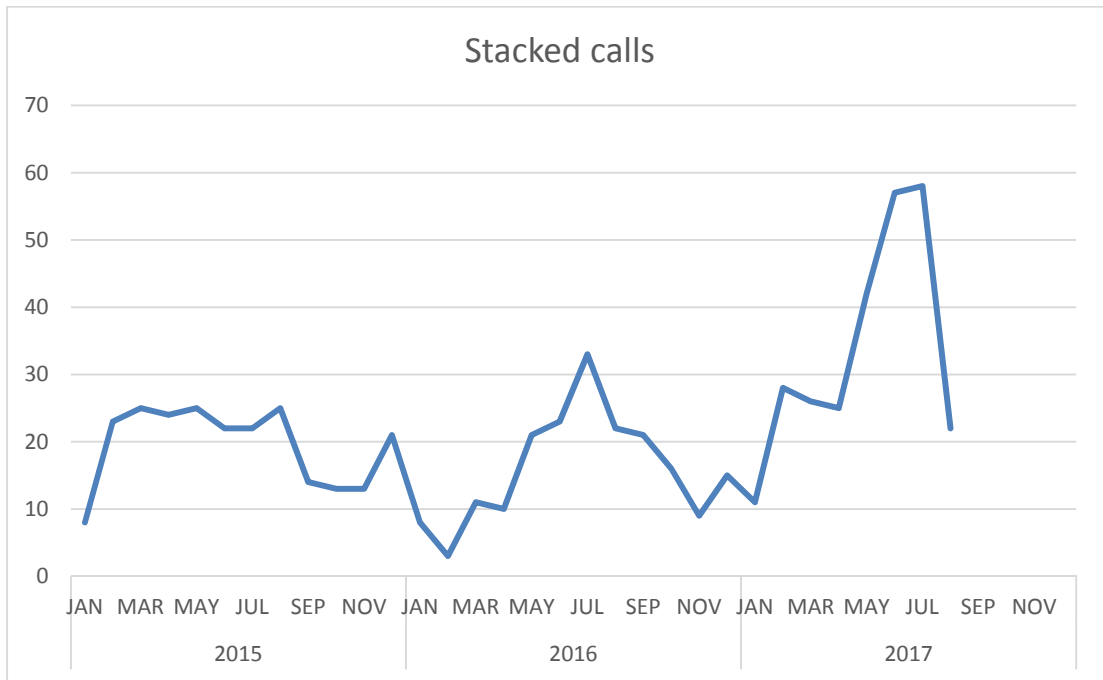

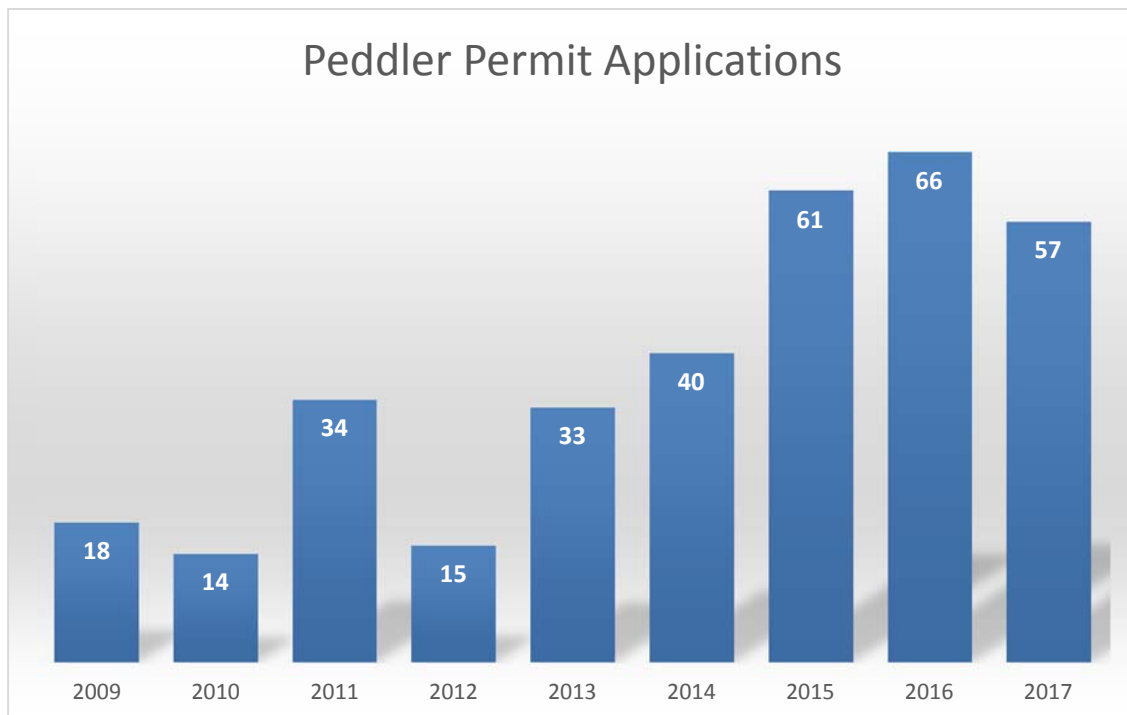

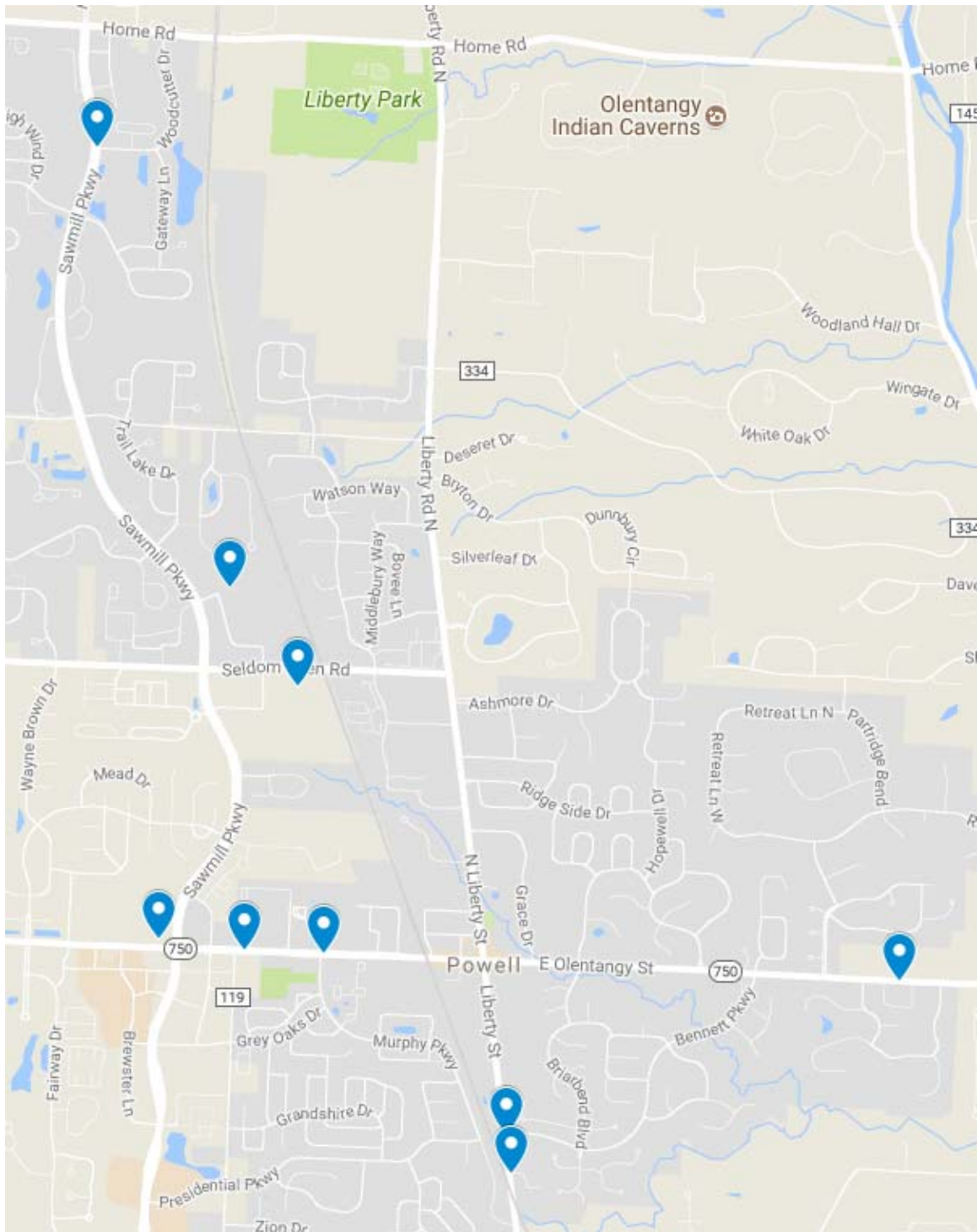

TRAFFIC CRASHES – PUBLIC & PRIVATE PROPERTY

- 8/1/2017 **ACDA** | Unit 1 and Unit 2 were westbound of SR 750 just east of Village Pointe Drive. Unit 2 stopped for traffic and Unit 1, unable to stop struck Unit 2. Unit 1 was cited.
- 8/3/2017 **Hit-Skip** | Unit 2 was parked at 484 W. Olentangy St. Unit 1 struck Unit 2 and left the scene without reporting the crash.
- 8/9/2017 **ACDA** | Units 1 and 2 were northbound on Sawmill Pkwy. Unit 2 slowed to turn right onto Woodcutter Dr. and Unit 1 failed to slow down and struck Unit 2 in the rear. Unit 1 was cited.
- 8/9/2017 **Hit-Skip** | Unit 2 was parked in a parking space with no one in the vehicle. Unit 1 (unknown vehicle) struck the rear driver's side of the vehicle and left without stopping or providing their info.
- 8/11/2017 **Hit-Skip** | Unit 2 was parked at a construction site. While it was parked, Unit 1 (unknown vehicle) struck the rear bumper and a mobile generator. Unit 1 did not leave any information and did not remain on scene.
- 8/12/2017 **ACDA** | Units 1 and 2 were westbound on E Olentangy St. at 825 E Olentangy St. Unit 2 stopped for traffic and was struck in the rear by Unit 1.
- 8/14/2017 **Backing** | Unit 2 was parked at 4000 W. Powell Rd, when Unit 1 improperly backed out of a parking spot and struck Unit 2.
- 8/24/2017 **Hit-Skip** | Units 1 and 2 were parked in the parking lot at 8771 Moreland Dr. Driver of Unit 1 returned to vehicle and attempted to back from a parking space and struck Unit 2 in the left rear area and left the scene without reporting the crash.
- 8/28/2017 **Hit-Skip** | While turning right onto Bennett Parkway Unit 1 struck a light pole located on the north east corner of the intersection. Unit 1 left the scene.
