

Delaware County Sheriff's Office DRUG EFFORTS



- ★ **Drug Liaison**
One-stop resource for the community to provide coordination of county services, drug education & prevention, and treatment information & referrals.
- ★ **School Resource Officers**
Provide education, support, and resources to students, staff, and families, and offer age-appropriate drug curriculum and leadership programming to each county school district.
- ★ **Drug Task Force**
Local, state, & federal law enforcement collaborative working to reduce availability and distribution of drugs on the streets.
- ★ **Drug-Sniffing K-9s**
Highly trained K-9s help detect drugs in a variety of settings.
- ★ **Drug Recognition Experts**
Deputies with specialized training in detecting when people are impaired by drugs other than—or in addition to—alcohol.
- ★ **Narcan Access**
Deputies carry this lifesaving drug that reverses the effects of an opiate overdose.
- ★ **Overdose Follow-up Visits**
Drug liaison and law enforcement official visit with people who have overdosed a day or so following the incident to offer support and resources.
- ★ **Drug Drop Box**
A secure and convenient drug drop box allows residents to safely dispose any outdated/unneeded medications. Located at the Delaware County Jail, this drop box is accessible 24/7.
- ★ **Jail Programming**
Volunteers/community partners provide opportunities and programming to support inmates while incarcerated, then link them to resources to help them succeed once released.
- ★ **Mental Health Initiatives**
Delaware County is part of the Stepping Up Initiative, which seeks to reduce the number of people with mental health disorders and substance abuse from jail.
- ★ **Community Re-entry**
Assisting offenders to make a successful transition from incarceration to lead stable, law-abiding, and productive lives in our community.

Retail Theft and Shoplifting

- Retail theft or shoplifting is the most common type of theft/larceny reports DCSO takes each year.
- In 2016 and first quarter 2017, there were 425 shoplifting reports with 70 different locations.
- 53% of these reports result in charges, while 68% of reports have suspects identified.
- Most of these thefts take place during Second Shift.

Crimes Against Property

- While theft reports are up, breaking & entering and burglary reports are down.
- Overall, thefts are about the same.
