OPERATIONS COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

I. <u>2018 COMMUNITY ATTITUDE SURVEY</u>

The Committee reviewed questions related to capital improvements from the 2016 Community Attitude Survey and made suggestions on wording. Saperstein & Associates will conduct a phone survey with a cross-section of approximately 400 residents in late February-early March. Each phone survey typically takes approximately 15 minutes. Residents will be asked about a variety of topics pertaining to Powell, from what they like most about living in the City to what public officials should consider to be top priorities for the future.

ACTION ITEM: The Committee would like to move forward with conducting the 2018 Community Attitude Survey in February. The Committee would like to send their suggestions to Marty Saperstein for his review.

II. <u>CIVILIAN RESPONSE TO ACTIVE SHOOTER EVENTS TRAINING SEMINAR</u>

Councilman Daniel Swartwout discussed hosting an active shooter training seminar for residents. He attended a training through the Franklin County Sheriff's Office recently and would like to hold a free training for the community.

ACTION ITEM: The Powell Police Department and Delaware County Sheriff's Office will work together on hosting a free training for residents in 2018. Police Chief Gary Vest will put together a timeline for the Committee.

III. PRESIDENTIAL/OLD SAWMILL INTERSECTION ACCIDENTS

The frequency of accidents at the Presidential Parkway & Old Sawmill Road intersection appears to be increasing. The City met with Liberty Township and Delaware County recently to discuss the safety of this intersection as most of the intersection is outside of the City's jurisdiction. The County Engineer's Office has conducted a warrant study at the intersection the past two years and the intersection hasn't warranted any traffic device.

ACTION ITEM: Continue to monitor the intersection in 2018 and work with Liberty Township and Delaware County.
