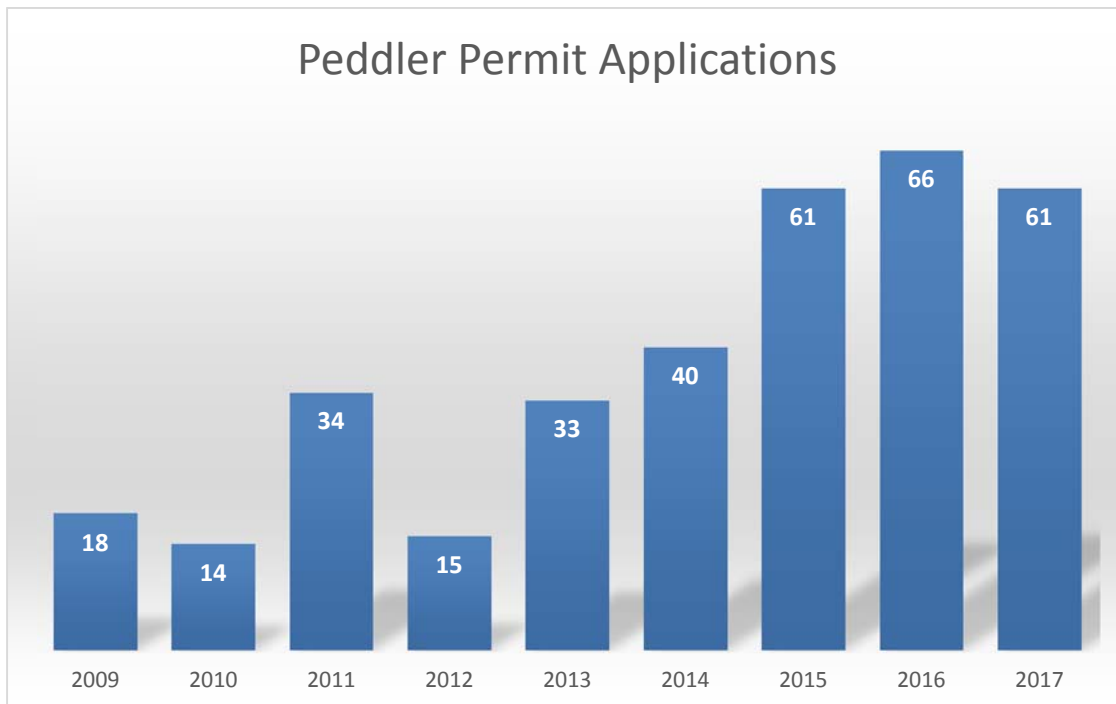

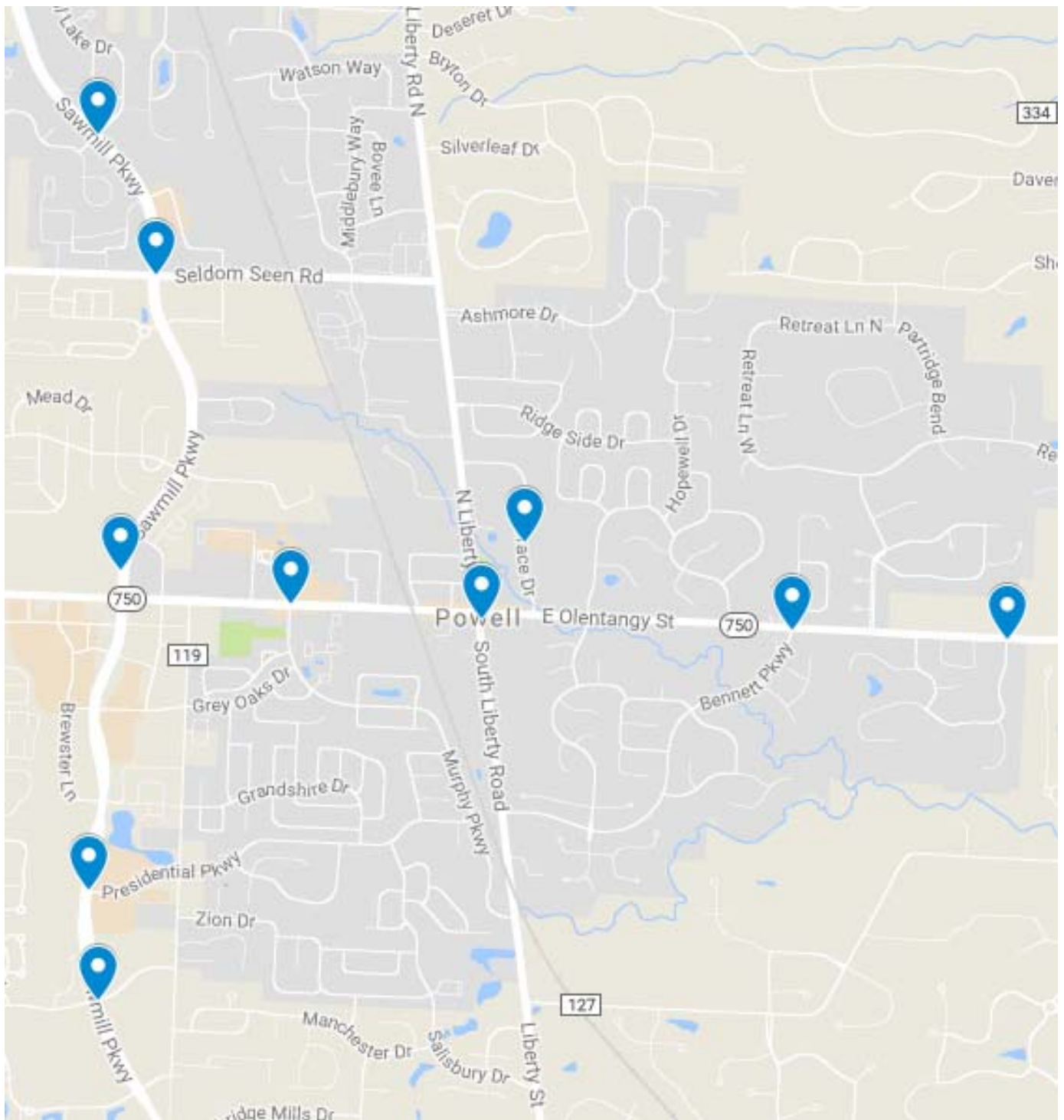
## TRAFFIC CRASHES – PUBLIC & PRIVATE PROPERTY

- 11/2/17 **ACDA** | Unit 1 and Unit 2 were both stopped at the stop light located at SR 750 on Grace Dr headed southbound. Unit 1 failed to maintain an assured clear distance ahead and as a result, struck Unit 2 from behind.
- 11/2/17 **ACDA** | Unit 1 and Unit 2 were both stopped at a red light on Seldom Seen Rd. at Sawmill Pkwy. Unit 1 failed to maintain an assured clear distance ahead and as a result, struck Unit 2 from behind.
- 11/7/17 **ACDA** | Units 1 and 2 were eastbound on SR 750. Unit 2 stopped for traffic near Valley Run Dr. and Unit 1 was unable to stop and struck the rear of Unit 2. Unit 1 was cited.
- 11/10/17 **Deer** | Units 1 and 2 were southbound on Sawmill Pkwy. north of Trail Lake Dr. Unit 1 was in the left lane and struck a deer. After being struck by Unit 1, the deer became airborne and struck Unit 2.
- 11/14/17 **ACDA** | The driver of Unit 2 was stopped in the northbound lane of Sawmill Parkway at the intersection with Presidential Parkway at a red light. The light turned green and she began to drive forward when she stated her car stalled. The driver of Unit 1 then rear-ended Unit 2. Unit 1 was cited.
- 11/15/17 **Marked Lanes** | *Injury* | Unit 1 was heading northbound on Sawmill Pkwy. when it entered a left turn lane at the intersection of North Hampton Drive. Rather than executing a left turn, Unit 1 continued northbound on Sawmill Pkwy. and struck Unit 2 which was stationary, also in a left turn lane, in the southbound flow of traffic on Sawmill Pkwy. Unit 1 was cited.

- 11/16/17 **ACDA** | Units 1 and 2 were westbound on SR 750 approaching Bennett Pkwy. Unit 2 stopped for traffic and was stuck in the rear by Unit 1. Unit 1 was cited.
- 11/18/17 **ACDA** | *Injury* | Units 1 and 2 were eastbound on SR 750 at Murphy Parkway. Unit 2 stopped for traffic and was struck in the rear by Unit 1. Unit 1 was cited.
- 11/21/17 **ACDA** | *Injury* | Units 1 and 2 were both northbound on Liberty St. approaching the intersection of SR 750. Unit 2 stopped to make a left turn onto SR 750 and was struck from behind by Unit 1. Unit 1 was cited.
- 11/23/17 **Failure to Yield** | Unit 2 was traveling through the parking lot when Unit 1 approached a perpendicular road in front of her, did not stop, and struck Unit 2 on the side.
