



TRAFFIC CRASHES

- 5/2/18 **Failure to Control** | Unit 1 was in the parking lot of 232 W. Olentangy Street. Unit 1 attempted to back from a parking stall while the vehicle was in drive. Unit 1 drove forward over the curb, striking a pole and the building.
- Hit Skip | Unit 1 was westbound on SR 750 at the CSX Railroad crossing. Though the gates were descending, Unit 1 continued through the railroad grade, struck the railroad gate, and continued westbound on SR 750, fleeing the scene. The driver of Unit 1 was identified and cited.
- 5/7/18 **Failure to Control** | Unit 1 struck an air conditioning unit while pulling out of a business on West Olentangy Street going northbound.
- 5/14/18 **Failure to Control** | Unit 1 was westbound on Seldom Seen Rd. Unit 1 drove off the right side of the road and drove over two sets of CSX track rails. Unit 1 was cited.
- 5/17/18 Failure to Control | Unit 1 was entering the parking lot after making a left turn. The driver of Unit 1 cut the corner too sharp and struck Units 2 and 3. Units 2 and 3 were stopped waiting to leave the lot to travel on SR 750. The driver for Unit 1 admitted fault for the crash.

- 5/18/18 Failure to Control | Unit 2 was parked in the parking lot when Unit 1 tried to navigate a turn into the parking space next to Unit 2, striking them in the left rear quarter panel.
- ACDA | The driver of Unit 2 was northbound on Sawmill Parkway when some geese entered the roadway in front of Unit 2. Unit 2 braked hard to avoid hitting the geese. The driver of Unit 1 was unable to stop and rear-ended Unit 2. Unit 1 was cited.
- 5/23/18 Hit-Skip | Injury | Driver of Unit 2 states he was crossing between medians when his mower was struck by Unit 1, causing Unit 2 to strike the curb of the median. Driver of Unit 2 states the impact caused him to be pushed into the curb causing damage to the mower. Driver of Unit 2 states Unit 1 continued southbound without stopping.
- 5/24/18 **Backing** | Unit 1 was backing from a parking space (northbound) at Village Pointe Shopping Center and struck Unit 2 in the left side, while driving through the lot.
- 5/25/18 Failure to Control | Unit 1 was traveling northwest on Galloway Dr. Unit 1 failed to control the vehicle, crossed into the opposite lane, struck a curb, a telephone box, and a tree. Unit 1 was cited.
- 5/29/18 **Failure to Yield** | Unit 1 and Unit 2 were in the parking lot of 256 W. Olentangy when they collided.
- 5/31/18 **Failure to Yield** | Unit 1 was driving westbound and Unit 2 was driving northbound through the parking lot at 50 S. Liberty. Unit 1 failed to yield and struck Unit 2 in the right rear panel of the car.

The Justice, Safety & Legal Studies Department at Columbus State Community College would like to sincerely thank you for making our 2018 Job Fair a fantastic event.


