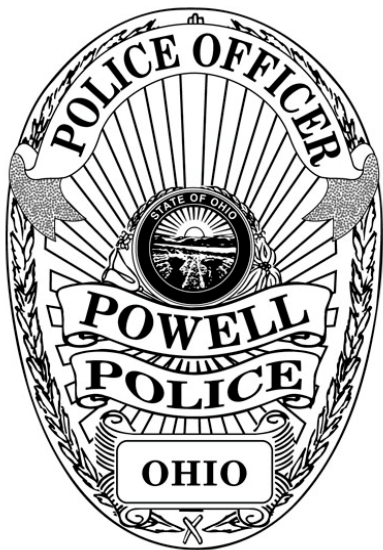

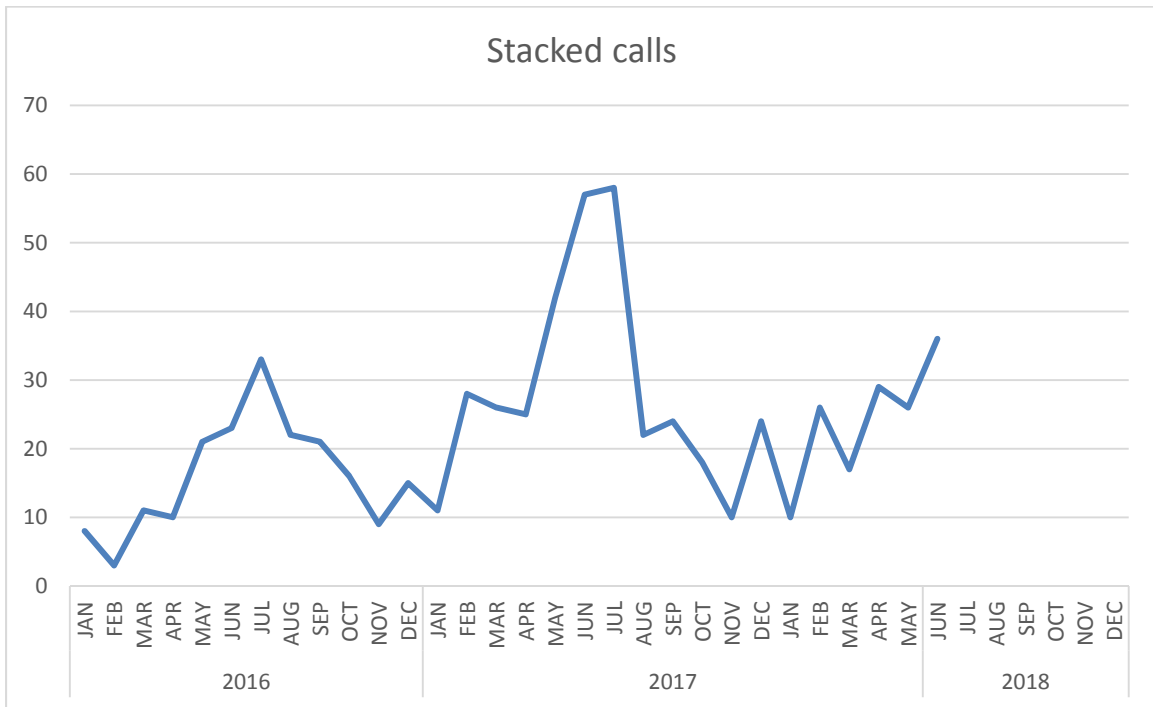
Shoplifting | An adult and a juvenile were caught shoplifting at a business on Sawmill Parkway. The stolen items were recovered, and charges are pending.

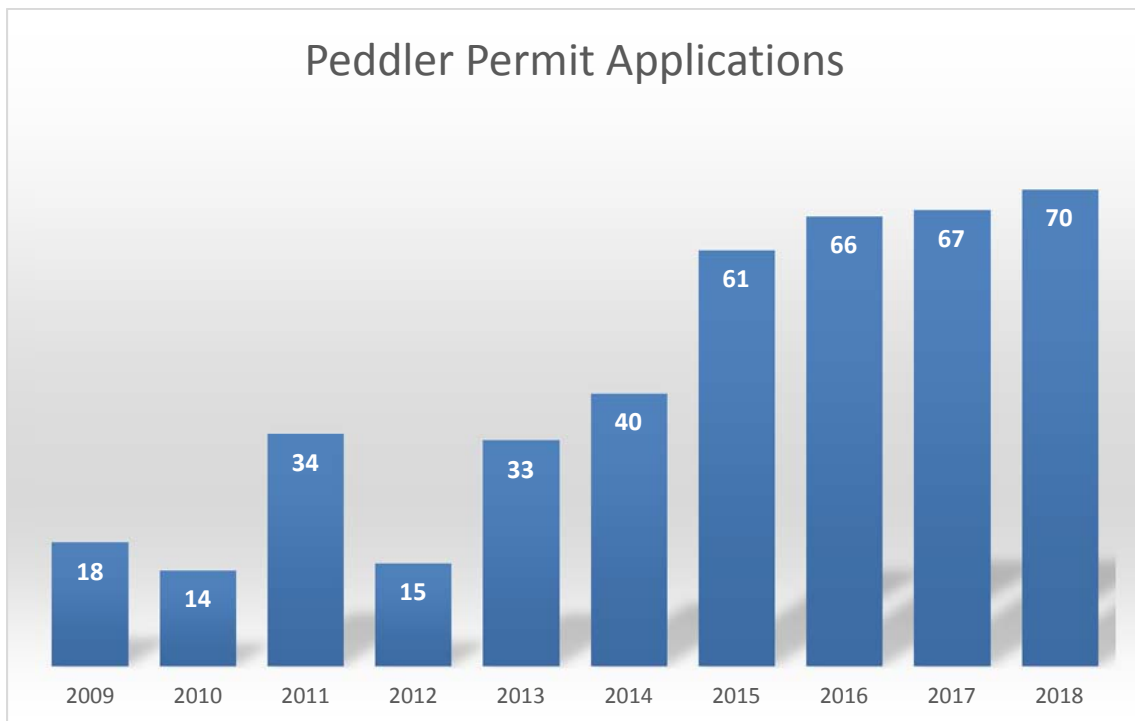

The City of Powell Police Department uses this data to assign officers for selective enforcement efforts.

Average Speed: The average speed of all vehicles registered by the Stealth Stat device.

TRAFFIC CRASHES

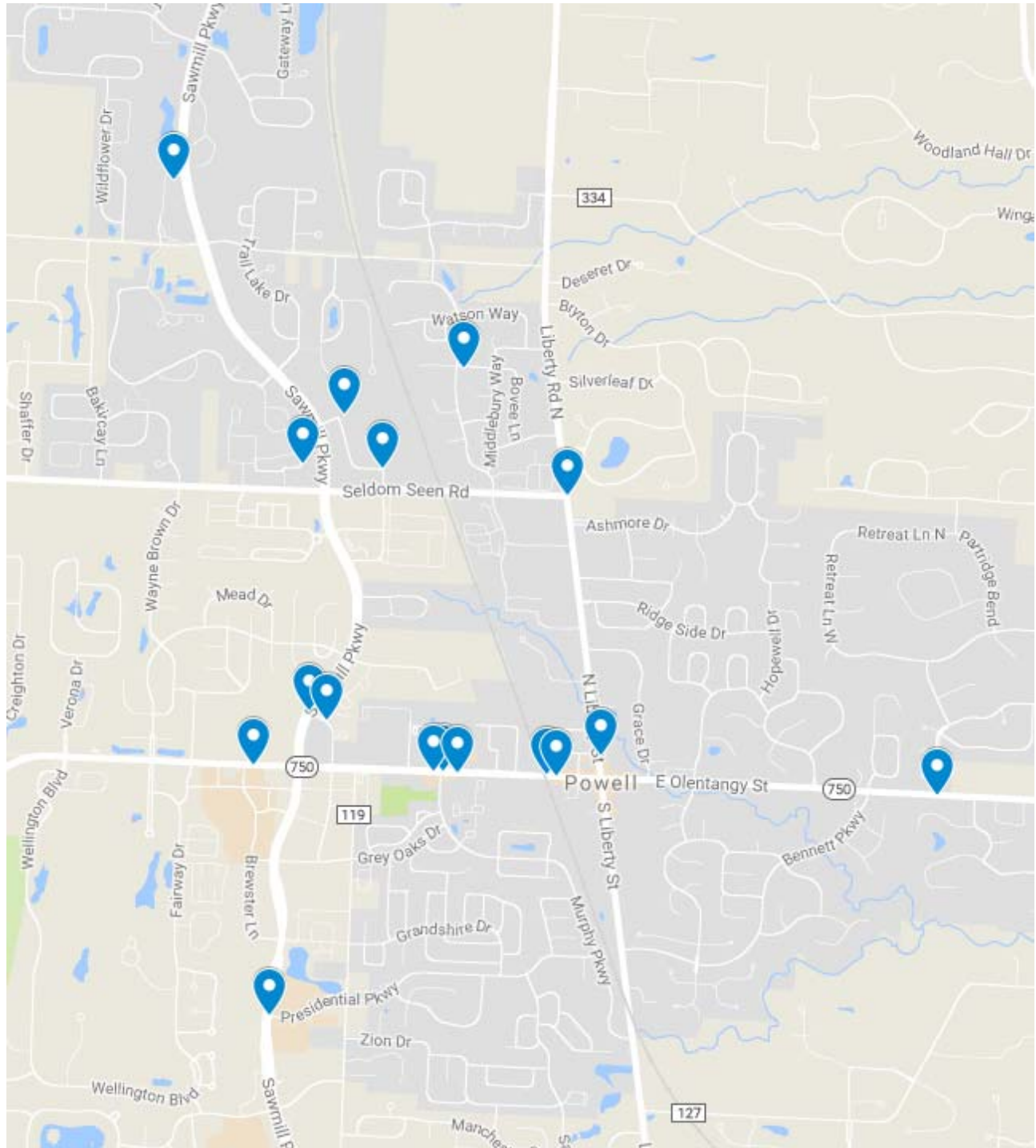
- 6/4/18 **Backing** | Unit 2 was parked in the lot of 44 N. Liberty. Unit 1 was attempting to park and backed into Unit 2.
- 6/7/18 **Bicycle** | *Injury* | Unit 1 was northbound in crosswalk. Unit 1 was struck by Unit 2 which was traveling westbound through the intersection.
- 6/8/18 **Failure to Control** | Unit 1 was in the lot of 8761 Moreland St. Unit 1 attempted to drive under a canopy and struck the canopy with the top of the vehicle.
- 6/8/18 **Backing** | The driver of Unit 1 was backing out of her driveway and struck Unit 2 who was headed northbound on Village Park Drive. Unit 1 was cited.
- 6/10/18 **ACDA** | Unit 2 was slowing in traffic eastbound on SR 750 at Thornbury Ln. Unit 1 was also eastbound, behind Unit 2. Unit 1 failed to use assured clear distance ahead and struck Unit 2. Unit 1 was cited.
- 6/12/18 **Failure to Control** | *Fatal* | Unit 1 was facing northeast on Clermont Blvd. when Unit 1 driver lost control while backing, struck the curb, ran off road left, crossed Galloway drive, struck a curb and ejected the driver. Unit 1 continued through the grass in reverse and

driverless, made a 270 left hand loop in reverse, struck a curb and came to rest.

- 6/15/18 **Backing** | Unit 1 was attempting to back from the garage access road and struck the structure at 3639 Stoneway Point.
- 6/18/18 **ACDA** | Units 1, 2, and 3 were eastbound on SR 750 west of Murphy Parkway. Units 2 and 3 started forward towards the intersection and stopped. Unit 1 continued forward and struck Unit 2 pushing Unit 2 into Unit 3. Unit 1 was cited.
- 6/20/18 **Red Light** | *Injury* | Unit 2 was westbound on Presidential Parkway attempting to turn left onto Sawmill Parkway on a green light, when Unit 1 ran a red light northbound on Sawmill Parkway and struck Unit 2 on the side. Unit 1 was cited.
- 6/21/18 **Failure to Control** | Unit 1 was attempting to make a right turn onto SR 750. Unit 1 left the right side of the road and struck a stop sign while attempting to make the turn. Unit 1 was cited.
- 6/22/18 **ACDA** | The driver of Unit 2 stopped on N. Liberty St. to allow bicyclists to finish crossing the street before she made a right turn onto Seldom Seen Road. The driver of Unit 1 struck Unit 2 from behind. Unit 1 was cited.
- 6/22/18 **Backing** | Unit 1 was pulling from a handicap parking space and struck Unit 2 while doing so. Unit 2 was illegally parked in the cross hatch portion of the handicap parking area.
- 6/23/18 **Failure to Control** | *Injury* | Unit 1 was being driven in a reckless manner by a 13 year old driver. The driver was unable to manage a curve, after reporting she was distracted by one of her five passengers. The driver rolled the golf cart into a ravine, causing injury to herself and two passengers.

- 6/26/18 **ACDA** | Units 1 and 2 were westbound on SR 750 near address 238. Unit 2 stopped for traffic and was struck in the rear by Unit 1. Unit 1 was cited.
- 6/28/18 **Failure to Control** | Employee at location reported Unit 1 left the carwash traveling northbound. He stated Unit 1's passenger side tires went over the curb and Unit 1 struck a car wash sign with his tire causing minor damage. Unit 1 stated he felt his truck going over the curb but did not realize he struck the sign.
- 6/29/18 **Bicycle** | *Injury* | Unit 1 was eastbound on a sidewalk. Unit 2 was stopped in traffic while attempting to enter the westbound lane of SR 750. Unit 1 was unable to stop the bicycle as the brakes were inoperable. Unit 1 attempted to swerve in front of Unit 2, but struck the right front bumper.
- 6/30/18 **Red Light** | Unit 2 had the green light and was turning south onto Sawmill Pkwy from Galloway, when Unit 1, travelling south, disobeyed the red light and struck Unit 2. Unit 1 was cited.
