- Completed Job Description for Firefighter- Paramedic. This was the last one to be completed. Each position now has an up-to-date job description that includes expectations of performance.
- Replaced the dishwasher at Station 321
- Developing a mailer for residents to help explain EMS Billing
- SOP's to coincide with billing have been developed and will be trained on/instituted as we get closer to a go live date
- Began work on a Community Risk evaluation. This will evaluate each business and residential area to determine the risk of an emergent situation to the community and its impact on our ability to respond

- Paramedic refresher training for those on this year's schedule has been completed
