NOTABLE CASES







DATE	CAUSE	NARRATIVE	
5/1/19	Hit-Skip	Unit 2 was parked on the access road to the businesses around 187 W. Olentangy. Unit 1 was southbound on the access road, attempted to navigate a right turn, and the rear portion of the trailer struck Unit 2.	
5/13/19	Hit-Skip	Unit 1 was southbound on Sawmill Rd. and attempted to turn left onto Grey Oaks Dr. Unit 1 drove off the right side of the roadway and struck a light pole. Unit 1 left the scene without reporting the crash.	
5/17/19	Medical	The driver of Unit 1 experienced a medical episode (believed to have passed out) and drove his vehicle onto a mulched divided median on Sawmill Parkway.	
5/18/19	Yield	Units 1 and 2 were westbound on Grandshire Dr. near Paynes Depot. Unit 1 stopped in the roadway to make a U-turn. Unit 2 started to proceed past Unit 1. Unit 1 started to turn and struck Unit 2. Unit 1 was cited.	
5/19/19	Deer	Unit 1 was traveling westbound on Presidential Pkwy towards Sawmill Rd. Unit 1 swerved right to avoid striking a deer that was in the roadway before striking a tree on the side of the road.	
5/20/19	Bicycle	Unit 2 was southbound on S. Liberty St. approaching 50 S. Liberty St. when Unit 1 attempted to cross S. Liberty St. from west to east from a bicycle path. Unit 1 failed to yield the right of way to traffic and was struck by Unit 2.	
5/21/19	ACDA	Units 1 and 2 were westbound on Home Rd. near Woodcutter Dr. Unit 2 stopped for traffic and Unit 1 struck Unit 2 in the rear. Unit 1 was cited.	
5/21/19	ACDA	Units 1, 2, and 3 were stopped at a red light on Seldom Seen Rd at Sawmill Pkwy. heading westbound. Unit 1 thought they got a green light and hit the gas pedal, crashing into the back of Unit 2 and pushing Unit 2 into the back of Unit 3. Unit 1 was cited.	
5/25/19	Yield	Units 1 and 2 were at an intersection for a driveway access to the Giant Eagle business complex. Unit 2 proceeded east through the intersection as Unit 1 entered the intersection, failing to see Unit 2. Unit 1 struck Unit 2 on the passenger side door with the front driver's side of Unit 1.	

DATE	CAUSE	NARRATIVE
5/27/19	Yield	Unit 1 was stopped at a stop sign on Beech Ridge Drive waiting to cross southbound over SR 750 onto Bartholomew Blvd. Unit 2 was eastbound on State Route 750 and had the right of way. Unit 1 did not see Unit 2 approaching and pulled into the path of Unit 2 causing a crash. Unit 1 was cited.
5/30/19	ACDA	Injury Unit 2 was northbound on Sawmill Pkwy. when the vehicle ran out of gas just south of Trail Lake Dr. Unit 1 was traveling northbound on Sawmill Pkwy. and struck Unit 2 in the rear. Unit 1 was cited.
