# NEW VOTING EQUIPMENT/POLL WORKER INFORMATION

**VOTERS WANT TO SEE WHO THEY HAVE VOTED FOR IN WRITING BEFORE THEY CAST** THEIR VOTE. THE NEW VOTING EQUIPMENT ALLOWS THEM TO CREATE THEIR BALLOT WITH THEIR CHOICES, REVIEW IT BEFORE PRINTING THEIR BALLOT, VERIFY IT AGAIN AFTER THEY HAVE PRINTED THEIR BALLOT BUT BEFORE THEY CAST THEIR BALLOT IN THE TABULATOR.

## Three Steps to Casting your Vote

#### Poll Pads implemented in 2015:

• The poll worker looks up the voter on the poll pad to make sure they are at the right voting location and has the voter sign the poll pad. They issue a paper authority to vote slip that the poll worker uses to pull up the correct ballot on the ballot marker for the voter.

#### New Equipment implemented 2019:

- Ballot Marker (Freedom Vote) -The voter marks their selections on the ballot marker. Ballot marker prints their ballot.
- Ballot Tabulator (OVO) Voter inserts their ballot to cast their vote. The screen shows the voter that their ballot has been cast

- Our goal EACH election for Delaware County is to recruit over 900 Election Workers
- · Polling locations must have a balance of Democrat & Republican recruits
- Need to staff 165 Precincts represented in 48 Polling Locations not to exceed 1,400 voters) (Precinct is geographic area designated for voting
- Polling Locations have a varying amount of Election Equipment based on Precincts
   1 Polling Location has 10 precincts (Genoa Baptist Church)
   POLL PAD
- 2 Poll Pads is the minimu
- 1-8 Ballot Marker carts
   (4 Ballot Markers on each cart)
- 2-4 Ballot Tabulators
