




NUMBER OF SUBSTANCES INVOLVED IN FATAL OD



SUBSTANCES FOUND MOST FREQUENTLY IN THOSE THAT DIED OF AN OVERDOSE




JAN-JUNE FATAL OVERDOSES




JANUARY-JUNE 2019 OD DEATHS BY PLACE OF RESIDENCE AND DEATH



UNACCEPTABLE MATERIALS

- Plastic bags
- Styrofoam
- Medical sharps or syringes
- Window or drinking glass
- Coat hangers or scrap metal
- Plastics that are not bottles or jugs



Important Items to Avoid

- cassette & VHS tapes
- pressurized tanks
- clothing & sheets
- hoses & chains
- plastic bags
- hangers



Did you know that recycling the right items increases the benefits of recycling for you?

The fewer unacceptable items we get, the more we can focus on recycling. That means investing in state of the art recycling facilities and making recycling easier and more accessible for customers like you.

Unacceptable Plastic Items

- plastic items without a bottle neck
- plastic tubs, trays & cups
- plastic toys & bikes
- plastic buckets
- plastic wrap



Unacceptable Paper Items

- toilet paper, paper towels & contaminated items
- photos, photo paper or specially-treated paper
- laminated paper (thick or waterproof coverings)
- paper plates & cups
- tissues

Unacceptable Glass Items

- ceramic & porcelain
- drinking glasses
- window glass
- light bulbs
- dishware



Other Unacceptable Items

- anything touched by gas or oil (even if empty or clean)
- hazardous or flammable material
- paint cans (spray & liquid)
- wood & yard waste
- rubber hoses
- rope & string
- electronics
- Styrofoam
- car parts
- batteries



Unacceptable Metal Items

- needles, sharps & medical equipment
- metal pots, pans & pipes
- metal wire


