



TRAINING

In June the department conducted 47.25 hours of training to include **legal update**, autopsy observation, firearms qualification, use of force review and defensive tactics. •

TRAFFIC SURVEY (STEALTH STAT)

The City of Powell Police Department uses this data to assign officers for selective enforcement efforts.

Average Speed: The average speed of all vehicles registered by the StealthStat device. **85th Percentile:** 85 percent of all vehicles were at this speed or slower.


Ten-Mile Pace: The range of speeds in which the majority of vehicles were traveling. **Vehicles per Hour:** On busy streets, the device cannot accurately count vehicles in the far lane.

CASE	DATE	CAUSE	NARRATIVE
20-0367	6/2/2020	HIT-SKIP	Unit 1 was parked off the roadway in the area of Guardwell and O'Connell Streets. Unit 1 was stuck by an unknown vehicle.
20-0368	6/2/2020	HIT-SKIP	Unit 1 failed to yield at the stop sign and struck Unit 2. Unit 2 fled westbound on Grandshire Drive at a high rate of speed.
20-0374	6/5/2020	ACDA	While sitting at the traffic light facing west on Olentangy Street, Unit 2 was struck in the rear by Unit 1. Unit 1 explained they were reaching for an article and lifted their foot from the brake causing them to strike Unit 2. CITED.

CASE	DATE	CAUSE	NARRATIVE
20-0380	6/7/2020	ACDA	Units 1 and 2 were eastbound on North Hampton Dr. at Sawmill Pkwy. Unit 2 stopped due to an approaching emergency vehicle. Unit 1 failed to stop and struck Unit 2. CITED.
20-0391	6/10/2020	FAILURE TO CONTROL	Unit 1 was northbound on Grace Dr. Unit 1 struck the curb on the right side of the roadway and then came to a stop shortly thereafter.
20-0393	6/10/2020	FAILURE TO YIELD	Injury Unit 2 was westbound on SR 750 at Olentangy Ridge PI. Unit 1 was turning left from Olentangy Ridge PI. onto SR 750. Unit 1 failed to yield the right of way and struck Unit 2. CITED.
20-0395	6/11/2020	FAILURE TO CONTROL	Unit 1 was westbound on Presidential Pkwy. As Unit 1 approached the intersection, a vehicle was turning westbound from Salisbury Dr. Unit 1 moved over to avoid being struck by the turning vehicle. Unit 1 went off the roadway and struck the stop sign as he moved over.
20-0415	6/18/2020	HIT-SKIP	Unit 1 was turning westbound from Depot St. onto S.R. 750. Unit 1's trailer struck the stop sign while completing the turn. Unit 1 failed to stop after striking the stop sign.
20-0421	6/20/2020	BACKING	Unit 1 backed northbound from a parking space at 4000 W. Powell (SR 750) and struck Unit 2, which was traveling southeast.
20-0427	6/23/2020	ACDA	Unit 2 was traveling northbound on Sawmill Parkway in the left-hand turn lane approaching Home Rd. Unit 1 was traveling northbound on Sawmill Parkway in the left-hand turn lane behind Unit 2. While Unit 2 was stopped, Unit 1 failed to maintain an assured clear distance and struck Unit 2 in the rear of the vehicle. CITED.
20-0432	6/24/2020	ACDA	Unit 2 was traveling eastbound on W Olentangy St. Unit 1 was traveling behind Unit 2 in the same direction. While Unit 2 was stopped, Unit 1 failed to maintain an assured clear distance and hit the rear of Unit 2. CITED.
20-0437	6/25/2020	ACDA	Units 1 and 2 were southbound on Sawmill Parkway approaching Seldom Seen Rd. Unit 2 slowed to make a turn eastbound onto Seldom Seen Rd. when it was rear ended by Unit 1. CITED.

May 2020 Crash Type


