NOTABLE CASES

Fraudulent Unemployment Claims | There were nine cases of identity theft through unemployment claims in December. In most cases, the victim's employer spotted the fraud, but in some cases, the unemployment office sent a PIN or a debit card to the victim. These cases were referred to Job & Family Services, Fraud Department, for investigation with Detective Darren Smith assisting.

Stolen Vehicle | A car was stolen from the Powell Crossing neighborhood. The car was unlocked with the keys inside. The Ohio State Highway Patrol recovered the car a few days later on the interstate near Orient, Ohio and apprehended two suspects. The suspects were also charged with Drug Possession, Carrying Concealed Weapons, and Having Weapons under Disability. •



COMMUNITY ORIENTED POLICING

K9 ACTIVITY

K9 Axel and his handler, Officer Jason Latiolais, were deployed once in December for a narcotics sniff. They completed 14 hours of training.

TRAINING

In December the department conducted 52 hours of training to include ICS and All Hazard Training, Crimes against Seniors, Legal Updates, Ohio Child Passenger Safety Law and Motorcycle Safety.



USE OF FORCE

The Powell Police Department carefully tracks all uses of force by the agency. In the interest of transparency, we will report these incidents monthly. There were two uses of force in December:

- Officers responded to a report of a fight. The suspect was in his car and refused verbal commands to exit the vehicle. Officers assisted him from the vehicle. While being handcuffed and searched, the suspect resisted, injuring an officer. Leg shackles had to be used.
- Officers responded to a theft complaint. After attempts to de-escalate failed, officers displayed Tasers to stop the combative subject from destroying property. Officers used handcuffs, balance displacement and joint manipulation to take the subject safely into custody.

TRAFFIC SURVEY (STEALTH STAT)

The Police Department uses this data to assign officers for selective enforcement efforts.

Average Speed: The average speed of all vehicles registered by the StealthStat device.
85th Percentile: 85 percent of all vehicles were at this speed or slower.
Ten-Mile Pace: The range of speeds in which the majority of vehicles were traveling.
Vehicles per Hour: On busy streets, the device cannot accurately count vehicles in the far lane.



20-0795	12/2/20	HIT-SKIP	While parked facing northeast in a parking spot at 4000 W. Powell Rd., Unit 2 was struck by an unknown vehicle between the hours of 1300 and 2100. It is unknown the direction of travel or vehicle type for Unit 1
20-0799	12/4/20	MARKED LANES	Unit 1 was stopped eastbound on SR 750 at the Bennett Pkwy. traffic light. Unit 1 was in the turn lane to turn north onto Cressingham Ln. Unit 2 started traveling eastbound on SR 750. Unit 1 merged into the eastbound travel lane and struck Unit 2. CITED.
20-0801	12/5/20	DEER	Unit 1 was traveling northbound on Sawmill Pkwy. and ran off the road to the right to avoid striking a deer. Unit 1 then struck a street sign near the intersection of Sawmill Pkwy. and Market Street.
20-0805	12/7/20	BACKING	Unit 1 was pulling out of a parking spot to the southwest and struck a fire hydrant while at 3368 Mainview Ct.
20-0808	12/8/20	ACDA	While traveling westbound on SR 750, Unit 1 struck Unit 2 from behind. Unit 2 had slowed in traffic when it was stuck by Unit 1. CITED.

CASE	DATE	CAUSE	NARRATIVE
20-0819	12/15/20	FAILURE TO YIELD	Unit 1 was northbound on Sawmill Parkway and intending to turn west onto Royal Belfast. Unit 1 proceeded with the turn and was struck by Unit 2 which was southbound in the driving lane of Sawmill Parkway. Unit 1 believed he had a turn arrow and Unit 2 states he proceeded on a green light. Nothing indicated that Unit 1 had a left turn indicator for the area. CITED.
20-0821	12/15/20	HIT-SKIP	Unit 1 was traveling in front of 384 Briarbend Blvd and struck the mailbox in front of the home. It is unknown if Unit 1 was going forward or backing up at the time of the crash.
20-0830	12/24/20	ACDA	Unit 2 was stopped eastbound at the traffic light at Seldom Seen Rd. at Liberty Rd. in the left turn lane. Unit 1 was traveling eastbound on Seldom Seen Rd. and struck Unit 2 in the rear of the vehicle.
20-0831	12/25/20	FAILURE TO YIELD	While attempting a left turn from the east to the south onto Sawmill Parkway from Presidential Parkway, Unit 1 struck Unit 2. Unit 2 was traveling straight through the intersection on a green light eastbound. CITED.
20-0834	12/27/20	MARKED LANES	Both units were traveling north on Sawmill Pkwy. near the intersection at Galloway Dr. Unit 1 failed to stay within the marked lanes of the road and sideswiped Unit 2. CITED.
20-0837	12/29/20	FAILURE TO CONTROL	Unit 1 was eastbound on Club Way Ct making a right hand turn onto Hopespring PI when it went over the curb at the corner of Club Way Ct and Hopespring PI and struck the street sign.
