COMMUNITY ORIENTED POLICING

C.O.P. Officer Audrey Wilt began a new session of the Citizens Police Academy in September; she gave Boy Scouts a tour (pictured); registered six bicycles; attended the 9/11 ceremony and a high school pep rally at Village Green Park; installed two car seats and inspected one golf cart. Officer Wilt also serves as our volunteer coordinator, and she recruited several volunteers to work at the Community Bonfire (see below). •

COMMUNITY BONFIRE

Residents came out for an evening of free food and entertainment at the annual Community Bonfire. City and Citizens Police Academy Alumni Association volunteers were the backbone of the event. People were able to gather safely outside and meet first responders and fellow community members. •

DRONE

None of the drones were deployed in September. •

TRAINING

In September, the department conducted 232 hours of training to include **First Line Supervision, Firearms, Defensive Tactics, Hostage Negotiator Training, CPR/First Aid** and **Supreme Court Legal Update.**

CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM

Police respond to many calls that are not criminal in nature. Using a CIT (Crisis Intervention Team) disposition notifies HelpLine of Delaware and Morrow Counties that there is a need for further assistance. HelpLine reviews the call



information and assigns follow up by agencies such as Maryhaven, SourcePoint, Syntero, or the Delaware County Board of Mental Health.

In September, there were four calls with CIT dispositions.

USE OF FORCE

The Powell Police Department carefully tracks all uses of force by the agency. There were no uses of force in September. •



TRAFFIC SURVEY (STEALTH STAT)

The Police Department uses this data to assign officers for selective enforcement efforts.

Average Speed: The average speed of all vehicles registered by the StealthStat device.
85th Percentile: 85 percent of all vehicles were at this speed or slower.
Ten-Mile Pace: The range of speeds in which the majority of vehicles were traveling.
Vehicles per Hour: On busy streets, the device cannot accurately count vehicles in the far lane.




TRAFFIC CRASHES



CASE	DATE	CAUSE	NARRATIVE
21-07167	9/9/21	FAILURE TO YIELD	Unit 1 was southbound on N. Liberty St. and stopped for a traffic signal in the eastbound turn lane. Unit 2 was northbound on N. Liberty St. and stopped for a traffic signal. The signal turned green for both northbound and southbound traffic. Unit 1 thought she had a green arrow and proceeded to turn left in front of Unit 2. Unit 2 veered to the left in attempts to avoid striking Unit 1. Unit 2 struck the passenger side of Unit 1. CITE
21-07719	9/10/21	ACDA	Unit 1 failed to maintain an assured clear distance ahead and as a result it struck Unit 2. At the time of the crash, both units were heading southbound on Sawmill Parkway at Village Club Drive.
21-07756	9/11/21	FAILURE TO CONTROL	Unit 2 was released off of a flatbed tow truck. It rolled back into the tow truck causing damage. Tow truck driver left the scene and gave his business card.
21-07864	9/13/21	FAILURE TO CONTROL	<i>Injury</i> Unit 1 was eastbound on Bennett Pkwy. Unit 1 stopped to reposition the vehicle. Unit 1 pulled forward and struck a light pole. The top of the light pole disengaged and fell on Unit 2.
21-08055	9/16/21	FAILURE TO CONTROL	Unit 1 was headed eastbound on Valley Run Dr. and Unit 2 was parked on the right side of the roadway next to the curb with a trailer attached. Unit 1 struck the trailer attached to Unit 2. CITE
21-08196	9/18/21	FAILURE TO YIELD	<i>Injury</i> Unit 1 was traveling north on Sawmill Pkwy. Unit 2 was traveling south on Sawmill Pkwy. Unit 1 began turning left from Sawmill Pkwy. to Home Rd, in front of Unit 2. Unit 2 swerved southwest to avoid striking Unit 1, continuing to travel on Sawmill Pkwy. Unit 2 swerved and traveled southeast and struck the center median and traveled south into northbound traffic. Unit 3 was traveling north on Sawmill Pkwy. in the left turn lane, and swerved to avoid being struck. Unit 2 struck Unit 3. Unit 2 swerved southwest and struck the center median.
21-08579	9/24/21	FAILURE TO YIELD	Unit 1 was eastbound on Ridge Side Dr. Unit 2 was southbound on Village Ridge Dr. Both vehicles had a stop sign as they approached the intersection. Both drivers advised that they stopped for the stop signs and started through the intersections. Both units came to contact within the intersection. At the time of crash, fault was not determined due to conflicting statements and a lack of evidence.

CASE	DATE	CAUSE	NARRATIVE
21-08969	9/25/21	BACKING	Unit 2 was parked facing westbound in the area of 30 W. Olentangy. Unit 1 attempted to park in front of Unit 2. Unit 1 backed up and struck Unit 2. Unit 2's owner was advised by an unknown party of the crash. Unit 2's owner left a note on the windshield of Unit 1 in reference to the crash but has not heard from Unit 1.
