



RESOLUTION 2022-14

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT WITH THE DELAWARE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ("COUNTY"), THE LIBERTY TOWNSHIP BOARD OF TRUSTEES ("TOWNSHIP"), THE CITY OF POWELL ("CITY"), AND THE DELAWARE COUNTY ENGINEER ("ENGINEER") FOR THE MULTI-USE PATHWAY PROJECT ALONG HOME ROAD.

WHEREAS, the Township, the City, and the County desire to cooperate on a joint project to extend a shared use path adjacent to Home Road (CR 124), between Sawmill Parkway (CR 609) and Steitz Road (CR 125), together with related transportation improvements (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Township has obtained an award of \$200,000.00 from the State of Ohio, through Senate Bill 310, which will be administered by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR), Office of Real Estate & Land Management (REALM), to be used toward construction of the Project.

WHEREAS, the City desires to provide monetary assistance for the Project, and specifically for the pedestrian crossing improvements at the intersection of Home Road and Northway Drive in amount not to exceed \$11,250.00.


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF POWELL, COUNTY OF DELAWARE, STATE OF OHIO, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: The City shall reimburse the Township \$11,250.00 or 50 percent, whichever is less, for the cost of the pedestrian crossing, including signs, pavement markings and the HAWK sign located at the intersection of Home Road and Northway Circle.


Section 2: The City Manager is authorized to cooperate with any necessary agencies and enter into a Cooperation Agreement with the County, the Township, and the Engineer in a form substantially similar to the agreement attached hereto as Exhibit A and included herein by reference.

Section 3: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including the Charter of the City of Powell and Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 5: This Resolution shall take effect on the earliest date permitted by law.


