NOTABLE CASES

Fugitive | A traffic stop was conducted, and the driver was found to have a suspended license, expired plates, open containers, marijuana and suspected methamphetamine. The passenger had multiple warrants from Missouri. She was taken to jail to await her return to Missouri.

Forgery | In March, two suspects passed six counterfeit hundred dollar bills at a business on Sawmill Parkway. Detectives took the bills to BCI



for latent print analysis. Months later, BCI identified one suspect from prints on the bills. Detective Smith consulted the Secret Service and found that suspect has a history of passing counterfeit bills. The suspect was indicted for counterfeiting, a felony of the fourth degree. •



TRAINING

In November the department conducted 127 hours of training. The agency training included Mental Health Crisis, Biological Evidence Collection for Sexual Assaults, CAT and Officer Wellness, Crisis Intervention, Impacting Narcotics in Ohio, Sexual Assault Investigations, Trauma and the Brain, Router Interrogations, Local Agency Security Officer Certification, Assisting Individuals in Crisis, Emergency Operations Management Functional Exercise, Agency Simunitions, and Criminal Drug Interdiction. •

USE OF FORCE

CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM

Police respond to many calls that are not criminal in nature. Using a CIT (Crisis Intervention Team) disposition notifies HelpLine of Delaware and Morrow Counties that there is a need for further assistance. HelpLine reviews the call information and assigns follow up by agencies such as Maryhaven, SourcePoint, Syntero, or the Delaware County Board of Mental Health.

In November, there were four CIT calls.

In November, COP Officer Audrey Wilt:


- Gave a safety presentation and cruiser/belt display at the Goddard School.

- Installed two car seats. •





CASE	DATE	CAUSE	NARRATIVE
22-19973	11/2/2022	FAILURE TO YIELD	Unit 1 was backing out of a parking space on S. Liberty St. and struck Unit 2 which was parked in a parking space directly across from the one that Unit 1 was backing out of. Unit 2 was unoccupied at the time of the incident.
22-20131	11/4/2022	FAIL TO CONTROL	Unit 1 was traveling south on N. Liberty St. Unit 1 made a right turn, traveling west and struck a fixed light pole.
22-20171	11/5/2022	BACKING	Unit 2 was traveling east in the parking lot on Center St. Unit 1 was backing from a parking spot, traveling north. Unit 1 struck Unit 2 in the front passenger's side.

Unit 1 ran a red light at the intersection of Sawmill Pkwy/ Home Rd causing Unit 2 to strike Unit 1 as it traveled through the intersection. CITE
22-20601	11/12/2022	FAILURE TO YIELD	Unit 1 was traveling westbound on Presidential Pkwy. when it attempted to make a left hand turn in front of Unit 2 who was traveling eastbound on Presidential Pkwy. Unit 1 failed to yield the right of way to Unit 2. Unit 2 struck Unit 1. CITE
22-20660	11/13/2022	FAILURE TO YIELD	Injury Unit 1 was traveling westbound on Home Rd. When it passed through a red light and struck Unit 2. Unit 2 was traveling southbound on Sawmill Pkwy. CITE


