o **OPRA Foundation Grant**

O An OPRA Foundation Grant was awarded to the Parks and Recreation Department for two communication boards, located at Village Green Park playground and Adventure Park playground. The grant amount was \$1,500 with matching funds in the form of installation and landscaping. The boards will allow non-traditional communicators the opportunity to express their feelings, needs, and wants when enjoying our playgrounds and splashpad. We are excited to add these communication boards to our parks and provide inclusive and equitable spaces for our users.

Bunny Hop

Over 250 children enjoyed visiting with the Bunny during our annual Bunny Hop.
 Families were able to reserved photo times and each child received a goodie bag and craft. The Powell Youth Council volunteered for this event and helped stuff over 200 bags, and created the photo backdrop. Volunteers also helped during the event with check in, passing out items and managing the photo line.

Tree City USA

The City of Powell has again been recognized as a Tree City USA. We have been a proud Tree City USA location since 1998. The Tree City USA program has been greening up cities and towns across America since 1976. It is a nationwide movement that provides the framework necessary for communities to manage and expand their public trees.
